FROM PASTOR IRWIN

Satan: The Old Fool

This year April Fools day falls on the day after Easter, which is perfect for what early theologians called "Risus paschalis" ("The Easter laugh"). The laughter is at the expense of Satan, who thought he defeated Jesus, until God raised him from the dead!

"In the Greek Orthodox tradition, the day after Easter was devoted to telling jokes. ... They felt they were imitating the cosmic joke that God pulled on Satan in the Resurrection. Satan thought he had won, and was smug in his victory, smiling to

himself, having the last word—so he thought. Then God raised Jesus from the dead, and life and salvation became the last words." (from Storytelling: Imagination and Faith, by William J. Bausch).

For centuries, in Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant countries, Easter Monday and "Bright Sunday" (the Sunday after Easter) were observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Parishioners and pastors played practical jokes on each other, drenched each other with water, sang, and danced. It was a time for clergy and people to tell jokes and to have fun.

The custom of Easter Monday and Bright Sunday celebrations were rooted in the musings of early church theologians like Augustine, Gregory of Nyssa, and John Chrysostom, that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. Easter was "God's supreme joke played on death."

This is the feast of victory for our God! Alleluia!

The office will reopen on Tuesday, April 16 at 9:00am.





CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Advent Lutheran Church

February 11, 2024

UNAPPROVED

The regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council was held on February 11, 2024 at 12:00pm. The following members were present: Becky East, Bonnie Arner, Stephanie Warmkessel, Pastor Irwin, Wendy Rowlands, Ray Smith, Cindy Hinsey, Joanne Frantz, Joy Frantz, Cindy Mattern, and Mark Blatt. Excused: Larry Grybosky Absent: none.

Council President Bonnie Arner called the meeting to order at 12:05pm.

Pastor Irwin led the council in a devotional.

Secretary's Report

The minutes from the January meeting were reviewed.

Motion: A motion to accept the Secretary's Report was made by Mark. It was properly seconded and approved without dissent.

Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed.

A revision will be made to Social Ministry Discretionary Fund as \$250 in gift cards were purchased for Free Little Pantry. \$250 should be deducted from Social Ministry Discretionary Fund, not Social Ministry Events. Under January 2024 Actual Operating Expenditures on the Operating Budget, line item 113 will be changed to \$0 and line item 144 will be adjusted to \$1,224.

Mission Investment Fund Checking Contingency Fund has been broken down into its components of Contingency Funds, Memorial Fund, and Capital Improvement Fund (includes monies from Ferrell Estate and Employee Retention Credit). Memorial fund has a total of \$30,000 between savings and a CD; these funds are used to replace paraments and similar items of a permanent nature that are not a specific donation request.

Lines 1-11 on the operating budget are separated by gray lines not visible on copies, Steph will work with Becca to make these lines visible on printed copies.

Motion: A motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was made by Ray. It was properly seconded and approved without dissent.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Irwin submitted a written report with the usual outline of his activities during the month. Council members were reminded to review Pastor Irwin's Church Meeting Principles.
